His death was a shock to his friends at home, in part because James was such a strong swimmer and had been training for a triathlon before his reserve unit was called to active duty in January. "We're all having trouble understanding how he could drown," said Sue Schafer, owner of the health club where James worked while going to college. "It just seems unreal." James and three other Marines were securing a "water point" near the Euphrates River so engineers could connect a pump and filtration system to provide drinking water to U.S. forces, said Gunnery Sgt. James Howard of the Naval and Marine Corps Reserve Center in Peoria, Ill. "He was a typical small town boy: hard-nosed and hard working," said Tim Lafferty, football coach at La Harpe High School. James played linebacker for four years and graduated in 2000. "He was more tough than talented," Lafferty said. "He got by more on grit than anything else." James enlisted in the reserves after high school graduation to help pay for college. He enrolled at Southern Illinois in the fall of 2001. He was majoring in kinesiology, the study of muscles and body movement, and hoped to be a fitness trainer, school officials said. When he left for overseas, the staff of the health club threw him a farewell party. He promised to be home by summer. His death has stunned co-workers. Said Schafer, the club owner: "I don't know where the 'awe' is, but this is where the 'shock' is."

A soldier who endured more than 100 surgeries after a sniper's bullet in Afghanistan left him mostly paralyzed has died in Topeka, less than five weeks after a crowd of airport well-wishers saluted his return to the city and his wife and family. He deployed to Afghanistan in February 2011 and was shot April 10 while on foot patrol in the Zhari district. The bullet, from a sniper's rifle, penetrated his spine and left him paralyzed from the chest down. In the following 10 months he underwent more than 100 operations, first at Walter Reed Medical Center in Washington, D.C., then at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore before he was transferred to a rehabilitation facility in Denver. Melissa Jarboe, a native of the northeastern Kansas town of Holton, spent as much time as possible with him during those months while their two daughters remained in Topeka to attend school.

Troy ran forward, to save that little girl and to save his buddies." Jenkins grew up in Evergreen, AL, the youngest of three children of divorced parents, raised by their father. "He loved music. He loved to roam the woods. And he loved to go fishing," his father said. "He was the kind of kid, if he had a problem, he'd take his radio out to the woods and try to think it out. He never got in any trouble, and he never lied to me." When he graduated from high school in 1995, Jenkins had already joined the Marines. He later joined the Army. Jenkins, who served in Afghanistan, was planning to leave the service in July and wanted to join the California Highway Patrol. He didn't want to leave his wife and two children, ages 4 and 2, alone again. "I think he had a premonition," his father said. His wife, Amanda Jenkins, said the circumstances of his death were not surprising. "He didn't have a selfish bone in his body. He was always thinking of other people first."
