Nave had a wife, Carrie, a son, Anthony, 6, and a 5-year-old daughter, Maeve.

President Bush awarded the I Expeditionary Force with a Presidential Unit Citation for heroism in action against an armed enemy for its involvement in Operation Iraqi Freedom from March 21 to April 2003. In that period, MEF conducted the longest sequence of overland attacks in the history of the Marine Corps.

NIEVES, Isaac Michael Nieves

Nieves is survived by his wife, Amy. He will be buried at Saratoga National Cemetery in Schuylerville, NY.

NIXON, Patrick R. Nixon

Marine Cpl. Patrick R. Nixon, age 21, of Nashville, TN; assigned to 1st Battalion, 2nd Marine Regiment, 2nd Marine Expeditionary Brigade, Camp Lejeune, NC; killed in action March 23, 2003 near Nasiriyah, Iraq while serving during Operation Iraqi Freedom. Marine Cpl. Patrick Nixon will be buried alongside thousands of other fallen Marines, soldiers, sailors, airmen and others at Arlington National Cemetery. "To know a loved one will actually be buried along with all those people who have served this country, it's an incredible thing," said his father, David Nixon. "We would quite frankly love to be anonymous again and for Patrick to be walking in the door. But that's not going to happen. But we're very proud for this honor to be bestowed on our son." Patrick Nixon, 21, of Gallatin, TN, died after his unit was ambushed March 23 in Nasiriyah, Iraq, where Marines were trying to secure a bridge. More than 260,000 people, including historical figures, war veterans and president John F. Kennedy, are buried in Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia. Nixon graduated from Overton High School in Nashville in 2000 and soon joined the Marines. Family members and friends describe him as a strong, sharp man who wanted to teach history, own horses and have a family one day.

NOLAN, Allen Nolan

Allen Nolan, age 38, of Marietta, OH; assigned to the 660th Transportation Company, Army Reserve, Zanesville, OH; died September 30, 2004 at Fort Sam Houston, TX, of injuries sustained Sept. 18 when his convoy vehicle struck an improvised explosive device and then came under small-arms fire in Balad, Iraq while he was serving during Operation Iraqi Freedom. Nolan is survived by his wife, Gail, and five children, ranging in age from 3 to 12.

NOLASCO, Marcos O. Nolasco
