LANGDELL, Joe Langdell

Joe Langdell was known for the World War II stories he could tell. He was well qualified, having watched from shore as his ship, the USS Arizona, sank during the Dec. 7, 1941, surprise attack on Pearl Harbor. The 100-year-old Langdell — Yuba-Sutter's last Pearl Harbor survivor and a fixture in Marysville's annual Veterans Day parade — died Wednesday, family members confirmed. He had an outgoing personality, as well as an affinity recounting the historic attack, and had been living at The Fountains care facility in Yuba City. "He talked to anybody about it," said John Langdell of Spearfish, SD, one of his two sons. "He relished being the center of attention. That was part of his makeup." Son Ted Langdell, who lives in Marysville, said his dad kept high spirits at The Fountains. "I guess you might say he was creating an endearing character over there," he said, adding a bit of mischief was likely involved. Joe Langdell's death came nearly four months after his 100th birthday. Ted Langdell was there holding his hand when he passed away. Riding in a wheelchair, Joe Langdell took part in November's annual Veterans Day Parade in downtown Marysville. His presence in the parade became a focal point for the yearly event. John Langdell said his father's remains will be interred at the site of the USS Arizona, the ship on which he served, next Dec. 7. A local public memorial service will likely be held in April, he said. Don Schrader, a local veterans advocate and a board member of the Museum of Forgotten Warriors in Yuba County, noted Langdell visited the museum from time to time. "He went to the parades and always wore his uniform," Schrader said. "It's the passing of an era. It is unfortunate, but we are losing those guys." Schrader also noted that Langdell seemed to take pleasure in letting people know about his wartime experiences. "I think he enjoyed it greatly, and I think he was very proud of it," Schrader said. "And he should have been." Langdell's passing leaves the Yuba-Sutter area with no surviving members of the Dec. 7, 1941, Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor. Fellow survivor Art Rodda, who lived in Sutter, died in 2013. "It certainly was the focal point of his service in the Navy and the attack on Pearl Harbor was the center of his life," John Langdell said of his father. "He took pride in it." The Appeal-Democrat has recounted Joe Langdell's story multiple times over the past several decades. As told to the A-D in 2009, he was 28 years old and asleep on Ford Island when the attack happened and watched helplessly from shore as the Arizona sank and 1,177 sailors assigned to it were lost. Retiring as a lieutenant commander, Joe Langdell was believed to be the last surviving officer assigned at that time to the Arizona. He was recently one of only seven survivors from the ship, John Langdell said. Joe Langdell told the Appeal-Democrat in 2009 that he likely would have been killed if he had been on board the Arizona when it was attacked. "Saw it sink? Hell, yes," he said in 2009. "I was right there on shore, as close as you could get while keeping out of the bomb range." Langdell helped other men wade to shore and get to the hospital, according to the A-D account. He said he was later asked to go with 15 other men who had sheets and pillowcases to gather all the bodies above the waterline. "You'll always remember it," Joe Langdell said at the time. "It's a milestone in your life — one of the most important battles in the world, in world history, and I've got my medals to tell about it." Born Oct. 12, 1914, in Wilton, NH, Joe Langdell was employed as a salesman after the war and, with his wife, sought out the warmer California climate — first in the Bay Area and later in the Yuba-Sutter area. He was a former owner of the Village Mart store in Yuba County. Arrangements are pending at Ullrey Memorial Chapel in Yuba City.

Joseph Langdell, a retired Navy Lieutenant Commander who was oldest survivor of the Japanese attack on the USS Arizona at Pearl Harbor, has passed away at the age of 100. According to the Associated Press, his son Ted stated that Langdell was living in a nursing home in Yuba City, CA at the time of his death. He is also the last survivor of the attack on his ship, which lost over 1,000 men during the Dec. 7, 1941 bombing. During the attack, Langdell had been inside a military base near the ship and when the attack occurred, he worked hard to attempt rescuing his shipmates and also help to remove the remains of those who died in the ship. "I felt absolutely helpless as I watched the attack," Langdell told the AP on the 56th anniversary of the attack. "If I had been aboard, I would have been killed in that No. 2 (gun) turret. That was the one that blew up. It was my luck to be assigned off the ship that day." Ted Langdell spoke of how his father did not discuss the attack and he went back to the site in 1976 for the first time. Joseph Langdell would later talk about his story, his son said, because, "It drew attention not just to him, but gave him the chance to tell stories." His ashes will be laid to rest at Hawaii's Memorial for the USS Arizona. The Arizona Republic reported that Langdell would always wear his USS Arizona caps. When his son asked why, Langdell would respond, "It acknowledges to people that I'm a survivor. The hat represents Arizona."

'He always talked about having a servant's heart and that made a good police officer,' she said. 'He suffered long enough and he's at peace.' Winter Haven City Manager Dale Smith said LeVine was a person of great character. 'He will be missed by all who knew him,' Smith said LeVine brought a sense of calm and stability to the department, said police Capt. Charlie Bird. Bird said everyone at the department was saddened by the news of LeVine's death. 'We knew it was coming but you hope some kind of miracle will occur, but that didn't happen,' he said. LeVine was selected to be the Winter Haven chief on Oct. 25, 2006, two days after then-chief Paul Goward resigned after sending a controversial e-mail to his staff about overweight officers. LeVine told The Ledger at the time that then-City Manager David Greene had called him about the job. They had worked together before. In November 1998, Greene, who was Lake Wales' city manager at the time, had promoted then-Capt. LeVine to the top job in the Lake Wales department. LeVine joined the Lake Wales department in 1981 and retired as chief in 2004. Lake Wales Police Chief Herb Gillis said LeVine was the kind of chief who got down in the trenches with his officers. 'When we were doing undercover drug operations, he'd be the first one out of the car during the takedown,' Gillis said. 'He came out and worked with his officers. Before his hiring in Winter Haven, LeVine was the law enforcement coordinator at the Kenneth C. Thompson Institute of Public Safety at Polk Community College - commonly called the Police Academy - that trains new officers. LeVine's last public appearance at the Winter Haven department was during a 2008 swearing-in ceremony for new officers. LINDER, Codye Gwen Linder

Aviation buff Codye Gwen Linder beat the odds to become one of the first women to fly U.S. military planes during World War II, and later helped her fellow WASPs win government acknowledgment of their military service. Linder, age 85, who died Feb. 8, 2008 of complications from Parkinson's disease, was proud of her stateside military service and would have flown combat missions if women had been given the opportunity, said her daughter, Barb Linder of Port Charlotte. "She always thought that women could do anything that men could," her daughter said. Linder was among nearly 1,100 Women Airforce Service Pilots who took on sometimes perilous assignments as civil servants at military bases throughout the United States during the war. The roles fulfilled by female pilots helped free up male pilots needed overseas as U.S. involvement in the war escalated. Linder test-flew repaired planes to make sure they were safe for combat, and flew planes towing targets for live anti-aircraft artillery practice by male gunners on training missions. WASPs also helped relocate planes from aircraft factories to the bases where they would be deployed. Linder survived a couple of close calls during her nearly 13 months of service through December 1944. During her first solo flight in a fighter plane, the landing wheels would not lock into place. After several unsuccessful attempts to correct the problem by ascending, diving and reascending sharply, as instructed by the traffic tower, she finally managed to dislodge a wire that had wrapped around the wheels' locking mechanism and landed safely, her daughter said. Another time, she landed a plane despite a malfunctioning wing flap. Workers later discovered that several tools they accidentally left in the repaired wing shifted during takeoff and jammed the wing flap, Barb Linder said. Although more than 25,000 women applied for WASP training, fewer than 2,000 were accepted, and fewer than 1,100 completed their Army Air Forces training, Barb Linder said. Unlike their male counterparts, the women had to buy their own uniforms and pay their own way to return home after completing their assignments. The 38 WASPs who died carrying out their duties received no medals, death benefits or military burials. Linder was one of many WASPs who wrote letters to Congress years later seeking recognition -- and vindication -- as war veterans. After years of resistance, the federal government recognized the WASPs in 1979 as former active duty military eligible for benefits through the Veterans Administration. Born Oct. 2, 1922, in Macon, GA, Codye Clinkscales developed an early interest in aviation when pilots, instructors and flight students would come into her parents' restaurant next to a small airport and talk about flying. She took flying lessons from a professional barnstormer and his wing-walking wife, and received her pilot's license by age 20. Linder graduated with honors from Winthrop College with a dual major in biology and chemistry before the war, and after the war worked as a government air traffic controller and a chemist at Johns Hopkins University's Applied Physics Lab before marrying decorated Army Air Forces veteran Walter Linder, a former fighter pilot, in 1947 and starting a family. While teaching high school honors science courses in Kettering, Ohio, for 19 years, she also taught a course in

aviation ground school that enabled students to apply for a private pilot's license upon completion, her daughter said. Linder's lifelong interest in aviation also included hang-gliding in her 50s and taking her first hot-air balloon ride in her early 80s, her daughter said. Upon retiring 25 years ago, she lived in Daytona Beach and Tampa before moving to Port Charlotte in 2001. In addition to her daughter, she is survived by two sons, Walt of Joplin, MO, and Cody of Columbus, Ohio; five grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren.
