NELSON, Alberta Ann Nelson

Alberta Ann Nelson was born in Erie, PA on Aug 14, 1937 to Frank Alton Nelson (1909-1959) and Katherine Storkel (1900-1982). Her only sibling was a half-sister, Irene Stephens McAleer (1919-1994). After graduating from the Andrews School for Girls in Willoughby, OH, class of 1955, she briefly attended St. John's Hospital School of Nursing, Cleveland, OH. In the late 1950s, she moved to New York City where she modeled. Alberta married Ryan MacDonald (Machunas) ca1959 in New York City. Their son Adam was born in NYC ca1960 and was a victim of sudden infant death syndrome at the age of two-months. Adam is buried in his father's hometown of Philadelphia, PA. Alberta never had any other children. Ryan MacDonald was the first male centerfold in the first issue of Playgirl magazine ca1978. Ryan and Alberta divorced ca1962 and Alberta moved to Beverly Hills, CA where she pursued an acting career. Alberta married Herbert Lester Gilman (b. November 19, 1922) in Erie, PA on February 14, 1971, his second marriage. Alberta fought cancer of the jaw/throat for several years, dying in Herbert's arms on April 29, 2006, at the home of Herbert Gilman's daughter, in Willoughby Hills, OH. Alberta was buried next to her mother and father at Laurel Hill Cemetery in Erie, PA on May 2, 2006. Herbert Gilman died on June 29, 2007. He was buried at Laurel Hill Cemetery in Erie, PA on July 1, 2007.

He also helped people in communities with less advantages with their taxes. Nelson is survived by his wife, Marian; two sons, Peter (Jackie Low) and their children, Ripley and Tess Nelson-Low, and Patrick (Cathy) and their children, Ruth and Cora. Trooper Jeffrey Nichols, age 27, was on routine patrol in Lamar County, TX when for an unknown reason his patrol vehicle left the roadway and struck a tree. Trooper Nichols sustained fatal injuries in the crash and died at the scene. The cause of the crash remains under investigation. There were no witnesses to the crash and the incident was reported by a passing motorist. Trooper Nichols had served the Texas Department of Public Safety for five years. He was stationed in Paris, Texas about 90 miles northeast of Dallas. He is survived by his parents. Trooper Nichols is the 218th Trooper to die in the line of duty since the inception of the Texas Department of Public Safety back in 1837.
