ABELSON, Alan Abelson

Alan Abelson, who spent 57 years as a writer, editor and chief columnist for financial news publication Barron's, has died at the age of 87. The author of the long-running Up and Down Wall Street column died Thursday of a heart attack, according to Sara Blask, a spokeswoman for Dow Jones, which publishes Barron's. Abelson had been on a medical leave of absence from Barron's for the past three months, The Wall Street Journal reported. "Financial journalism lost one of its leading lights today with Alan Abelson's passing," Ed Finn, Barron's editor and president, said in a statement. "For many readers, there can be no substitute for Alan's witty, wise and wonderfully written comments each week in Up and Down Wall Street. He touched so many lives and our thoughts and prayers are with his family." Abelson graduated with degrees in chemistry and English from City College of New York, and earned a master's degree from the Writer's Workshop at the University of Iowa. He joined Barron's in 1956 and became managing editor nine years later. During his years as editor, Abelson was noted for his training and mentoring of dozens of financial reporters and editors. Abelson began writing Up and Down Wall Street in 1966 and the column became a weekly mainstay of the publication for nearly half a century. He was still writing the column up until his medical leave. Randall W. Forsyth, who took over in Abelson's absence, will continue to author the column, according to the Journal.

Dr. Carlton Z. Adams, the south Georgia native who was a medical missionary pioneer and who became Sacramento's first black surgeon, died Sunday (Oct. 30, 2005) at his California home after a bout with cancer. He was 78. Dr. Adams was born and reared in Waycross, where he graduated from Center High School. After completion of college and medical degrees at Fisk University and Meharry Medical School in Nashville, he served as a military doctor before launching his practice in Bakersfield, Folsom and Sacramento. Among exemplary accomplishments was his appointment to the California Boxing Commission during the Reagan administration. He also was widely known for humanitarian and missionary activities at home and abroad, including the collection and delivery of surgical equipment and supplies in Third World countries. Dr. Adams' medical missions included service in impoverished communities of the Philippines and as a sojourner in several Caribbean and African nations, under sponsorship of the Women's Missionary Society of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. While serving in Liberia in 2004, he and his hosts survived a civil insurgency by hunkering down in the basement of an AME Church overnight and safely escaping the following day — walking over bodies of victims of the violence. He also delivered cargoes of general and medical supplies to Haiti and other HIV/AIDS ravaged countries after retiring from his California practice. According to his brother, Samuel Adams, of Waycross, "He seemed to be in relatively good health while in Brunswick last July attending the Adams reunion. He was upbeat and projected slides to show a large stone from a patient." His late brother, James, and parents, Mr. and Mrs. J.N. Adams, were Waycross business and religious leaders and charter members of the local NAACP. Survivors include his wife, Inez of Carmichael, Calif.; three daughters and a son, all physicians, Cheryl Adams Remson, of Louisville, Anne Marie Adams and Kathy Adams Berry, both of Sacramento, and Carlton Adams Jr., of Nashville.
