At the end of the war, he took part in a Victory in Europe parade in Paris before returning to the United States with his unit. Later, he joined the United States Army, where he served with the Army of Occupation at Yokahama, Japan. Because of his experience in the Merchant Marines, he was appointed by his captain to be Pier Officer, making him the youngest to ever serve in that position. Following the death of the five Sullivan brothers, Congress passed a law that siblings should not be active duty at the same time, and as a result, he was discharged from active duty since he had two older brothers also serving. He left the Army as a five-stripe technical sergeant, one of the youngest to achieve such rank, and later served five years in the Army Reserve. It was during this time that his enduring courtship with Carol Jean Cason became more serious, and on June 10, 1951, they were married in Waycross. Mr. and Mrs. Farr settled in their hometown, where they raised a family of six children. In addition to their children, Mr. and Mrs. Farr's nieces and nephews were frequent visitors, and they opened their home to exchange students on multiple occasions. Their house was always full of love and laughter, and their door always open to friends and family. A lifelong member of First Presbyterian Church, he served his church faithfully. At its peak in 1915, the program provided payments to more than 5,100 recipients, said Lou Dennard of the Florida Division of Retirement. In 1915, Mrs. Feagle married her first husband, William McCary Moseley, 49 years after he was discharged from the Confederate Army. He was 66. She was 21. They had five children in 13 years. Mr. Moseley enlisted in the Confederate Army in September 1864. "He was 15 when he joined up. He told me he lied about his age," Mrs. Feagle said in a February interview. "Everyone just loved to stop and talk with her," said Marcelle Bedenbaugh, Columbia County Veterans Service Officer, "she had a lot to tell about the war that her husband had told her." Bedenbaugh first met Mrs. Feagle 12 years ago, in her capacity of Veterans Service officer. But "I got to know her and learned to love her very dearly," she said. Born on a cotton farm near Wellborn, Mrs. Feagle "enjoyed the changes in Lake City," Bedenbaugh said. "She talked about how the street in front of the courthouse was brick, and pointed out where her father would pull up in his horse and buggy to do the shopping." In February, Mrs. Feagle served as parade marshal of the 1985 Olustee Battle Festival, in Lake City. Mrs. Feagle regularly attended the annual festival celebrating the Civil War battle in which Confederate troops routed the Union Army. "She couldn't wait until the next year to be in it," her daughter Doris O'Neal said. "That's all she talked about." For the occasion, she always dressed in an old-fashioned Southern belle gown and bonnet.
