Kelly followed Vinzant and in the yard of the Vinzant home beat Vinzant severely over the head. It was not clear just what instrument was used in the beating. Kelly then went back to his own home. Vinzant then got a 16-gauge automatic shotgun and went back to Kelly's home. Failing to get in at the front, he went around to the back, whereupon Kelly fired seven shots into him from a German-made 32 automatic pistol. Vinzant was struck in the head, body and legs and died immediately. Kelly was placed in jail and a warrant charging murder sworn out against him.
