The Rev. George Luey Zorn, 92, a minister in the United Methodist Church, died Thursday (Sept. 13, 2007). Funeral will be Saturday at 11 a.m. at First United Methodist Church in Albany. The son of a tenant farmer, he grew up in rural Barbour County, Ala. Though they were unable to do so themselves, his parents N.T. "Bud" and Lilly Zorn strongly encouraged him to seek higher education. He attended the University of Alabama where he was the commanding officer of the ROTC, and subsequently taught high school mathematics. Feeling a call to the ministry, he attended Candler School of Theology at Emory University. He married Sarah Elizabeth Austin of Dunwoody in June 1941, a marriage interrupted only by her death 61 years later. Together they faced the challenges of World War II and the rigors of ministry in service of the Lord and church they loved. During WWII he served under Gen. George Patton in France as deputy chaplain of the 3rd Army. He would later share his memories of his close contact with the general in speeches to civic organizations. He completed 30 years active duty and reserve service, retiring with the rank of colonel. George and Sarah Zorn served churches in Micanopy, Fla., and Georgia churches in Macon, Sylvester, Valdosta, Tifton, Waycross, Thomasville and Albany. The Rev. Zorn held key leadership roles in the South Georgia Conference and was twice elected to the General Conference of the United Methodist Church. His ministry was characterized by a Christ-like life and uncompromising diligence in service in God's vineyard. He was known for his wonderful prayers and sermons delivered without aid of notes and the recitation of many poems from his prodigious memory. He touched many lives in his long career that continued well beyond his retirement in 1979. As a husband, father, grandfather and great-grandfather, he was without parallel and blessed his family with love, faith, encouragement and inspiration that will be eternal.
